YOUR DREAM JOB?

At just 24 Carli-Ann Smith has achieved more than most people in their 50's have done. From travelling the world, mixing with famous people and motorcycle racers, to test riding brand new motorcycles, scooters and specialist clothing- Carli is living most bikers' dream.

Most only children lead a very sheltered life but not Carli. Her mum was determined to give her the opportunity to experience a wide range of activities and to give her lots of independence. At 12 she got her first bike, a Yamaha DT 125. Carli used to ride round the field pretending to be a journalist testing out a bike. Can she see into the future too? She then got a moped at 16 – she did her CBT on her 16th birthday – this was her main form of transport until passing her car test at 17. She then did her Advanced Driving test and passed that. At 18 she passed her bike test and at 19 she bought an R6 which she still has.



Carli attended Lincoln University where she gained a degree in Marketing and PR. Just 2 days after finishing University, she started work for the Harley Davidson UK press office and the BMW World Superbike Team providing video content and articles for the customer magazine. In order to do this she had to be at all of the race meetings held around the world. As you can imagine it was a real effort having to be there. Having to fly to places like Australia, Philip Island and Russia was an effort too! Carli was really enjoying her job and was there for two years but her life changed after she saw an advert in Motorcycle Monthly for a staff writer at Mortons Publishing. This was to be for Twist & Go and Motorcycle Monthly. Working for specialist magazines is difficult to get into as positions don't come up that often, however, Carli's knowledge, experience and enthusiasm paid off and she beat the competition to get the job.

In the time that Carli has worked for Mortons Publishing she has ridden a wide variety of motorcycles, sometimes up to 6 or 7 in one day. Her main bike at the moment is the KTM 390 which you can read about in Motorcycle Sport and Leisure. This is A2 compliant so articles can be used across the range of the powered two wheeler magazines Carli works for.

Carli recently went to the launch of the Yamaha Tricity bike, their first three wheeled scooter! Because Carli had ridden 3 wheeled bikes before she was able to give a good account of the differences between them and aim her article to the target market. She prides herself at 'putting on different hats' account of the differences between the person who would buy a certain bike.

Every week is different in the world of a journalist, this is what last week held for her:

Saturday – travel to the airport,

Sunday - fly to Amsterdam for the press conference for the Yamaha Tricity scooter

Monday - ride new bike round Amsterdam

Tuesday - arrive home early hours of morning, grab a quick kip then write up review so that it is on the website straight away.

Wednesday, Thursday, Friday catch up with all the other deadlines in the office, update website, respond to Facebook and deal with anything else that has come in. Whew!



Over the last month Carli has been touring in the Swiss Alps, Amsterdam for the Yamaha launch then Austria for the launch of the new KTM RC125. As you can tell it's definitely not a 9-5 job, in fact, Carli never stops working even when out for a personal ride she's checking out bikes, people, venues etc in case there's a story to be had. Carli's favourite ride partner is her mum Julie. Theirs isn't the typical mother/child relationship, it's more sister/best friend. Julie has encouraged Carli to grab every opportunity with both hands, supporting her every step of the way and always being there to help supporting her every step of the way and.

Carli was asked back to her University to talk to current students. She was asked if her enjoyment of biking had been spoilt now it was her regular job. The answer is a resounding No! Carli's enthusiasm and passion comes through when she is talking about work, bikes, riding etc. However, she does feel as if she should be collating facts and figures when she's watching any racing.

Another question was whether she suffered any sexism as motorcycling is seen to be very male dominated. Carli hasn't experienced any but; then again, she purposefully doesn't play on being female. She waits in line with the others, moves her own bikes and generally works as 'one of the lads'. Although she does still wear dresses and heels when she can!

After doing a BikeSafe course Carli had got the advanced riding bug and decided to investigate further advanced training. Obviously, the pressure was on as she's an experienced motorcycle journalist and high standards would be expected from the beginning. She's now had one ride out with Andy Greenslade which went very well. A quick quiz on road signs and then the ride out. Treating it as a ride out with a friend helped. Hopefully, when Carli is back in the country she'll be able to continue with her advanced training, but till then keep a look out for an extremely accomplished young lady rider with short red hair - that's her trademark!
