2Wheels enforcement rolls out across the county

Officers in Lincolnshire will be out on the county's roads in a dedicated effort to reduce the numbers of road casualties and anti-social driving amongst motorcyclists.

So far this year there have been 39 deaths on our roads and 10 of those have been motorcycle fatalities, which accounts for a significant percentage.

In line with the National Joint Roads Policing Strategy and the National Police Chief's Council (NPCC) the 2Wheels campaign will run from Monday (September 9th) to September 22nd.

Inspector Ewan Gell, of the Roads Policing Unit, said: "Lincolnshire attracts motorcyclists from near and far as they come to experience our rural roads, attend organised 'bike night' events, the racing at Cadwell Park or visit the coast, particularly during the evenings or weekends. We welcome them but want to make sure they and others around them ride safely."

"As part of the 2Wheels campaign we will have a highly visibly police presence on our roads and will be enforcing the fatal4 - drink/drug driving, mobile phone use, speeding and not wearing a seatbelt – and our officers will be out talking to motorcyclists about defensive riding, kit, and generally being safe.

"Of course, if we see anybody breaking the law we will take appropriate action."

DIARY OF EVENTS

Group Social Runs will incorporate café stops unless an alternative is specified. Please try to arrive at the meeting point in good time and with a full tank of fuel. Please let the run organizer know if you want to invite a guest. If carrying a pillion passenger, you should ensure that this is covered by your motorcycle insurance policy.

It is you, as the rider who is deemed to be in control of your motorcycle at all times during an observed or social run.

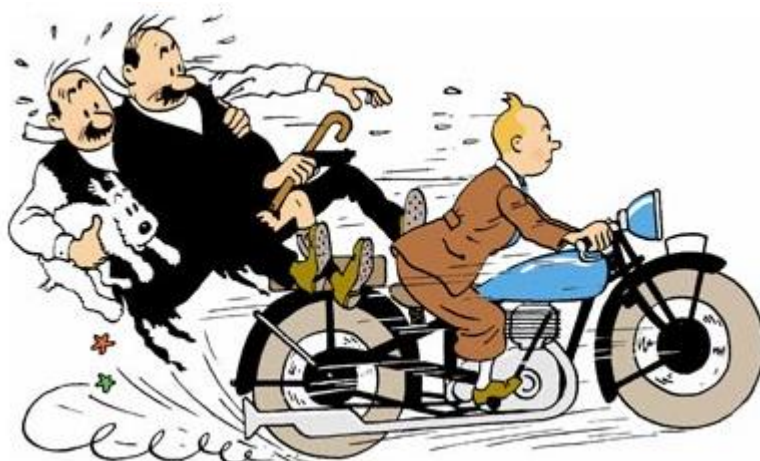

September's Observer meeting saw the team back in the office at Emprocom for the start of the winter months training. The Summer months on-bike training was evaluated and already the team are planning new things for summer 2020.

This month all the observer team would like to congratulate Kev Hewson on completing his IMI National Observer qualification.

As the Autumn edition of the IAM Roadsmart magazine drops through your letter box take time to read the article on page 56 about taking your next challenge of becoming an Observer.....And as some of our existing Observers will tell you, it's one of the best things they have ever done.

Watch out for those old Sods, they are just waiting to have you off!

The Beet season is here once again and can run right through until January, keep a keen eye out for early clues and signs of vehicles leaving the fields and dropping large amounts of mud on the carriageway. Be prepared to call the police on 101 to report it if you feel that the amount of mud on the road could affect road users safety.

OAP Observation Anticipation Planning



Understanding the importance of putting OAP in our ride cannot be underestimated. **‘Observation’** means using sight, hearing and smell to gain as much information about conditions as possible. Keen observation is the foundation of good riding and, for us motorcyclists, can mean the difference between life and death. If you do not know something is there you cannot react to it.

Careful observation gives you extra time to think and react, and so gives you more control over your riding. Use your eyes-scanning, use your eyes to build up a picture of what is happening all around you, as far as you can see, in every direction. The best way to build this picture is to use your eyes in a scanning motion which sweeps the whole environment: the distance, the mid ground, the foreground the sides and rear.

‘Anticipation’ The more time you have to react to a hazard, the more likely to deal with it safely.

Anticipating hazards gives you extra time. Make sure that you work on developing your experience at anticipation.

Anticipating the actions of other road users is important for your own and others safety. It is unsafe to assume that other road users have either seen you or will react correctly in any given situation.

Observing someone's general progress and road behaviour will give you some idea of what sort of driver/rider they are, but even the most conscientious drivers/riders can make mistakes.

Careful observing of other drivers/riders eye, hand and head movements will give you a better idea of their intentions, but you should always give yourself a safety margin of extra time and space to allow for others mistakes.

Skilful riders anticipate in order to make their riding plans more effective.

‘Planning’ Safe and effective riding depends on using the information gained from our observation and anticipation to make our riding plans.

The purpose of the plan is to put you in the right position, at the right speed, in the right gear, at the right time to negotiate hazards safely and efficiently. As soon as conditions change a new riding plan is required. Effective planning is a continual process of forming and re-forming plans.

Good advanced riders Observe, Anticipate and plan. OAP.

The LAM Sunday morning Group ride out is a great opportunity for associate members to get in some extra riding practice before their Advanced test. At the Sunday morning ride you will usually find many Observers and Full members who have got a vast knowledge and experience of Advanced riding who are always willing to assist others to achieve test standard. It is also another opportunity to practice the work that you have been doing with your Observer. We have three areas of the county covered, so take a look in the events diary and plan your next Sunday morning Group ride! *Look forward to seeing you there.*
