Observer and Associate


Well we are well into the autumn season now, and I'm pleased to see that the change of weather hasn't put many Associates off from continuing with their Advanced test preparation runs and the number a recent test passes. The change of conditions is something that we should consider as part of our Human factors, the wider world, we should ask, What could affect our ride today? Are the roads damp or greasy? Are there more wet leaves now than when you last went out? Quickly dropping temperatures? As an Advanced rider our mind set should be considering these questions before we have left home.

It has been very encouraging recently to see so many Full and Associate members out on the Sunday morning group rides. Its a great way to keep your Advanced riding skills up, and for Associate members it's a great way to meet other members of the group and get some extra practice between your Observed rides, well done to all

that have made it happen.

Recently I was following a rider as they came to a stop about one foot behind some stationary queuing traffic. This put the rider at risk if the vehicle ahead selected reverse by mistake, I have seen this happen before, and unfortunately the vehicle ahead was a tractor and plough combination! We should always be careful how and where we position our machine. This is especially true when stopping behind stationary vehicles in a queue. Always position yourself so that you can easily manoeuvre past the vehicle in front if it stalls or fails to move away. In addition this enables you to move out of the way if the vehicle behind is having difficulty stopping in time.

Imagine a triangle on the ground with the base along the rear bumper of the vehicle in front and the point towards you (see picture) Aim to avoid entering the triangle. In that way you will never become 'trapped'





Part of our 'how can the wider world effect my ride' during the winter we should consider using treated roads during a cold snap. Lincolnshire county council covers most of the county, and Highways England are responsible for Motorways and trunk routes. As motorcyclists we moan a lot about the effect of salt on our machines, but riding a motorcycle on an untreated road after a hard frost or black ice is a very daunting thought indeed!

View Lincolnshire gritting routes

We grit priority roads when road temperatures drop to around 0.5°C. This includes:

- all A and B roads
- at least one road from each of the county's main villages to a major traffic route
- at least one road within 500m of all train and bus stations, hospitals and schools
- additional roads depending on various risk factors, such as historic accident data

View gritting routes

During prolonged snowfall, we fit ploughs to our gritters. We may also call upon farmers and contractors to assist with snow clearing.

When we grit

From October to April, we work with the Met Office to monitor weather conditions around the clock. Our 43 gritting crews are on-call 24/7.

We grit based on weather forecasts, road surface temperature and dampness, air temperature and humidity.

When we grit, we try to do so either before the ice has set or once the snow has settled. Be aware that high-purity white salt is not always visible on the road.

Why roads might still be icy

This can be because:

- it takes time for the salt to take effect
- high winds or sudden rain can take the salt off the road
- if the road surface temperature drops below -7°C gritting is less effective
- if the road surface temperature drops below -15°C, gritting doesn't work at all
