The next Group observed ride is from the Ancholme Leisure Centre in Brigg on 12



February. As we are deep into Winter we have traditionally started these rides a little later so meet at **1130hrs** for prompt departure at **1200hrs**. In the meantime we will meet at The Homestead in Bracebridge Heath for regular monthly social rides and once every three months for observed rides.

The Fellow membership tier is open to all current full IAM members, it will offer you enhanced recognition and insurance benefits in return for your commitment to keep your advanced skills up to date by retesting every three years. The funeral of Peter Serhatlic

There was an escort of 3 police motorbikes blocking off the small road leading to the community church in Mexborough where the service was held.

Stuart Harrison and myself were there on bikes to represent our group and also a further clutch of bikes similarly representing other areas Peter would have worked in. Peter worked long days with many of them supporting more than the biking community.

I didn't count, but I'd guess that there were something like 30 or so bodies like ourselves who couldn't actually get into the church as it inside was packed, such was the attendance and so we stood "guard" outside, missing the eulogy, missing the opportunity to learn a little more about this tireless engine of a workaholic.

I don't know the reason for his sudden death, but donations were being accepted on behalf of the British Heart Foundation, so that probably says enough.

Part of the chat Stuart and I were having covered just how many of these events we've each been to recently and at similarly short notice. There we have it. We're all on a very short fuse I'm sorry to remind you. If there is anything you really want to do, don't delay.


Welcome to a New year. At the start of a New Year we often look back over our past year and try to improve the in-coming one by making New Year resolutions. As Advanced motorcyclists we should also set our goals for this coming year, we should always be looking to be the best we can with our riding As time passes post Advanced test, it is very easy to find that skill-fade can creep into your ride, this can be gradual, and you might not spot it.

How can we check our riding is still up to standard? Well we do have large team of very skilled Observers here at LAM who will be more than happy to have an hour out riding with you for a one to one session to give you an extra pair of eyes over your riding. As Observers we regularly get re-assessed from an IAM Roadsmart staff examiner, but we also have a system in place where we frequently check each other's ride. Try to adapt this system into your riding plans on a regular basis. We have Observers all over the county so give me a call if you want to take advantage of this which is free to all LAM group members or try to attend the LAM Sunday morning group Observed rides (details in the events diary).

There are also so many other things open to Full members to do under the IAM Roadsmart umbrella -

- That could be moving onto the Fellow program to keep your standards up.
- Looking at training to become an Observer. Signing up to the Masters course, the highest civilian road qualification.
- Look at joining the LAM Committee, a really great way to give back to the group.
- Iam Roadsmart Skills days are another opportunity to getter better understanding how to get the best out of your machine in a safe track environment, find the dates on the IAM Roadsmart website.

Set your own Goals, doing nothing this year shouldn't be an option.



Has the standard of driving and riding fallen since the pandemic? Reasons to be on our 'A' game

Sometimes while I'm out riding, it seems like the Wacky races out on the roads these days, but the level of lawlessness out on the roads makes for some truly shocking reading, with 2021 being the most dangerous on record.

According to the Ministry of Justice cases of drug driving, speeding and dangerous driving all hit record highs in 2021. Convictions for causing death and serious injury by careless or dangerous driving soared as did the cases where motorists inflicted serious injury while disqualified. In England and Wales a staggering 206 drink and drug driving offences are being committed every day. Drug driving convictions have more than trebled over 5 years from 7,683 in 2017 to 27,962 in 2021.

Also in 2021 there was a 13 per cent spike in drink driving cases, with 33,742 motorists finding themselves before the courts. The figures correspond to a 7 percent rise in fatalities for 2021, with 1558 people killed in collisions. Chief Constable Jo Shiner, lead on roads for the National Police Chiefs Council has quoted, Dangerous driving convictions have also leapt to the highest level since 2011 with 5,951 in 2021. There has been a 9 per cent rise in death by dangerous driving offences between 2020 and 2021. Convictions for causing serious injury by dangerous driving have also rocketed from 45 in 2013 to a record 604 during 2021.

Similarly, the number of motorists in court for causing bodily harm by furious driving and cases where disqualified drivers have caused serious injury are at an unprecedented high. In England and Wales speeding convictions have increased by 75 per cent from 116,595 in 2011 to 203,545 in 2021. In an indication of growing lawlessness, between 2011 and 2021 there has been an 84 per cent rise in motorists failing to supply information to police when required. In total, in 2021, 732,363 motoring cases resulted in fines or sentences, a rise of almost a quarter on 2020!

Closer to home deaths on Lincolnshire roads rose by 19 per cent from 40 in 2021 to 48 in 2022. Lincolnshire Road safety Partnership are working hard to improve safety and reduce death and serious injury on the roads. Recent initiatives include increased motorcycle training and awareness, and the introduction of Operation Snap, which allows motorists to alert police to potential offences using dash-cam footage. Speed awareness re-education training was delivered to more than 25,000 people in 2022 while the introduction of a Roads Policing Team to Lincolnshire Police is providing a significant targeted police presence while school road safety education is at an all-time high. Lincolnshire has the fifth-longest road network nationally, with no motorways and little dual carriageway with an economy which introduces a range of different road users including HGVs, LGVs, caravans, motorcycles to fast moving single carriageway rural roads.

Do we need to always ride our 'A' game? I sure think so!

This month will see the first Observer team meeting of 2023(details in Event diary) I look forward to seeing all who can make it.
