#### **CHAIRMAN'S CHATTER**

There were two new members, welcome to Gary Luff and Vernon Major. I hope you enjoy your advanced riding experience and I will hopefully see you at one of our rides or socials soon. For the associates don't forget an important part of your training is regular rides, whether individually or in groups, between your training rides with your observer and our group rides are an excellent opportunity to develop your skills.

The observers are the backbone of the group, without them we wouldn't be able to carry on with our part in making safer riders. If you fancy being an observer come along to an observer meeting. Observer meetings are now evening meetings normally on the last Wednesday of the month. If you fancy being an observer and want more details please give our Chief Observer, Jerry Neale, a ring on 07412 935333. He will be happy to talk to you.

The observer team have been busy mentoring their associates but also some of the Local Observers (LO) in preparation for the National Observer (NO) assessments which they all have to complete by April 2025 as the IAM will only recognise the NO qualification. Any that don't will no longer be able to observe for IAM RoadSmart. One LO has already decided that he will no longer remain as an observer once he has got his current associate through the test. I personally want to thank Andy Kitchen for all he has done in the group in the 20 years he has been member. He has been an observer for many of those years and was the Chairman when

I joined in 2009 and he has always been there to support me when needed. Hopefully we will still see him at rides in the future. Many thanks Andy, you will be missed.

#### **Observer and Associate**

The Observer team were back in the Lincoln office for the September Observers meeting. We were joined this month by ASDM Steve Ellis from IAM Roadsmart HQ. It was a very productive evening with some great guidance and advice from Steve that will further assist with the work that the Observer team do when out working with associates. Thanks to Steve, and all the members of the Observer team that attended and made it a very thought provoking evening.

Here in Lincolnshire in 2022, 48 people lost their lives following collisions, and a further 391 were seriously injured. Careless/reckless, or in a hurry, failed to look properly, and speed, were cited as contributory factors in half of all fatal collisions in that year. As Advanced riders we should always be thinking before every ride, about the four sections that make up our Human factors: The Rider, The Motorcycle, The Journey, and The Wider world. Make time to re-read Human factors in your Advanced Rider Course book to help avoid some of the contributory factors mentioned above.

Will Field will be running a session on the Second man drop off system at Octobers Sunday morning Observed ride from the WAVE (8<sup>th</sup> October). This is open to both associates and full members. A full pre ride brief will be given so get there early. If you haven't had a go at the group riding second man drop off system before, come and learn a new skill. If you have done it before come and keep your skills up! Ride your bike and have some Fun, Details on the group Facebook page.

#### **Oh Deer!**

Although we might have to put our clocks back at the end of October, remember that wildlife will continue to move around at their dawn and dusk, remember that wildlife does not change for GMT! Riders need to be to be extra vigilant in parts of the country where deer are common, as this is the time of year when they are more likely to stray onto road. During the rutting season, deer are on the move and riders are urged to be careful. October/November is breeding time, and that means deer will be more prevalent.



Deer are at their most active during the rutting season at dawn and dusk, so their activity coincides with times when the roads are at their busiest, through the morning and evening rush hours.

There are more than two million deer in the UK, and research which suggests that around 75,000 are involved in vehicle collisions each year, with 10,000 deer killed as a result.

The human death toll from deer collisions ranges between 10 and 20 annually, and industry estimates put the cost of damage to vehicles to be at least  $\pm 17$ m.

Some advice to riders to reduce risk from deer collisions which include: taking note of deer warning signs and being ready to encounter a deer at very short notice; dipping headlights because deer are more likely to 'freeze' in full beam.

Some points to remember:

1. Increased Activity: During the fall, deer are more active due to mating season and the search for food, leading them to cross roads more frequently.

2. Reduced Daylight: Days get shorter in the autumn, reducing visibility for riders during dawn and dusk when deer are most active.

3. Rutting Season: Bucks become more aggressive during the rut (mating season) making them less predictable and more likely to dart onto roads.

4. Foliage Cover: Falling leaves and foliage can obstruct sight-lines, making it harder to spot deer on the road.

5. Group Behaviour: Deer often travel in groups. If you see one, there may be more nearby, increasing the risk of multiple collisions.

6. Night Time Risks: Many motorcycle accidents involving deer occur at night when visibility is reduced, and deer are more active.

Remember as motorcyclists, to try and reduce the dangers of deer encounters, we should exercise caution, especially when riding in areas with known deer populations. Staying alert and riding at safe speeds are vital.
